RICH TALK IN THE CLASSROOM: FIVE KEY PRINCIPLES

- 1) **Start with Reflective Listening**: "What is this child/these children trying to tell me?"
- 2) <u>Teach Children to Listen to Each Other</u>: "Let's check in. Is this what the other child means?"
- 3) See Errors as Opportunities: "What does that answer tell me about a child's thinking?"
- 4) <u>Use Conflicts to Deepen Understanding</u>: "What does each child want and need?"
- 5) Model Compassion in Repairing Mistakes: "Next time, I'll try saying it this way."
