- Provides excellence in children's literature in writing, art, and design
- Shares nature, nature intersections, or climate peril with kids in developmentally appropriate, truthful ways
- Reflects the diversity of people in our world
- Delivers content grounded in real science
- Incites kids to action that would make a real difference
- Bonus: Topics that coincide with the City of Evanston's Climate Action and Resilience Plan (CARP) goals!

#### Climate Anxiety Criteria and Research

Anxiety is the Enemy of Collective Action and Collective Action is the Enemy of Anxiety!

Anti-Climate Anxiety Criteria for the Blueberry Awards

1. Love of nature first, climate action 2nd. (you only save what you love)

2. Recommend GROUP action, not going it alone

3. Must include practical suggestions for mitigating the actual problem shared in the text

4. State (or imply) that Adults are engaged. Never say, it is up to YOU or young people alone.

5. Follow child development guidelines about what kind of information kids can handle at which age. (Significant climate change information should not be shared with children under 8 years of age.)

Louise Chawla, Prof Emeritus, U of C, Boulder, Scientific Advisory Council of the Children and Nature Network gave a lecture at the Brookfield Zoo last year which led to these more formal guidelines.




























































































### How can I use these lists?
